The dividend is payable on January 9, 2026 to shareholders of record as of the close of business on January 2, 2026.

President & CEO Steve Lundgren stated, "We are pleased to announce an increase to the annual dividend paid to shareholders. The new dividend amount will be \$1.00 per share. Strong performance over several years has allowed Denali Bancorporation to grow its dividend from \$0.15 per share in 2009 to \$1.00 per share currently, a yield of approximately 6.2% per share based on projected December 31, 2025 book value.

The bank was formed by a group of local business owners and community-minded residents who believed it was important to the wellbeing of our community to operate a locally owned bank that offers local decision making and expertise in our unique environment.
