March 18 (Mon) Depart for Bali

You will be transported to the Minneapolis airport for your overnight flight to Bali.

March 19 (Tue) Bali, Indonesia

Upon arrival at the Ngurah Rai International Airport in Bali we will be transferred to our BEACHFRONT hotel for the next three nights. The remainder of today is at your leisure to enjoy the amenities of the resort or to head out and see some of the local sites on your own. Overlooking the Indian Ocean, your cliffside hotel in Nusa Dua offers modern luxury woven with Balinese tradition.

March 20 (Wed) Bali, Indonesia (B, D)

Following breakfast at the hotel, the morning will be at your leisure, allowing you to relax or explore freely and then enjoy lunch on your own. In the afternoon, we will drive to the southern part of Bali to visit the cultural park **Garuda Wisnu Kencana**, a Balinese landmark whose main attraction is a gigantic copper statue of Garuda Wisnu, the Vishnu Lord. It is one of the world's largest statues and looks absolutely stunning rising above the landscape. Tonight's dinner will be at the park's restaurant **Jendela Bali**. Jendela translates as "window" in Indonesian and this atmospheric restaurant, wrapped in a leafy open-air terrace, reveals to-die-for views over Bali. On clear days you can see the island's spectacular chain of volcanos looming above the southern plains. **Watching the sunset over the Indian Ocean, leaving a trail of crimson streaks in its wake**, it is a truly unforgettable experience. The enchantment continues as darkness descends and the island blazes with twinkling lights.

March 21 (Thurs) Bali, Indonesia (B, L)

Enjoy breakfast at your hotel followed by a journey into the countryside to visit small villages known for their trades and local temples. Your first stop is at Celuk Village which is known for its production of gold and silver handicrafts. Here, almost all of the villagers are skilled at crafting beautiful pieces that are sold worldwide. We will then continue to Singapadu Village which is rich in visual arts and known as the "Barn of Arts". Evolving from the barong mask, the arts in this village have grown to include sculptures and paintings. You will be treated to a special **Barong Dance** performance. Following a typical Balinese lunch in Ubud, you will pay a visit to the very popular Batuan Temple which is looked after by the local residents of the Batuan countryside. You will be impressed by its design which includes typical Balinese architecture with split gates, stone guardians, thatched shrines, and detailed carvings. Next you will visit the art village of Batuan known for its traditional style of painting, dancing and carving of wood panels. Painters from this village have been known since the 1930s for their dense, immensely detailed paintings of Balinese ceremonies, Bali dancer paintings, depictions of daily life, and increasingly, "modern" Bali. Your final stop will be at **Kerta Gosa**, an ancient court of justice. Admire the unique and traditional Balinese architecture in the gates, walls and main structures. Its distinctive highlights are the painted ceilings of the halls. These exquisite paintings are a fine showcase of the technique known as Kamasan, style. Our day will finish back at the hotel where the remainder of the day and evening are at your leisure with dinner on your own.



Enjoy breakfast at your hotel before checking out. En-route to the ship you will drive to Denpasar City, the current capital of Bali Province. Historically, it was the capital of the Badung Empire, controlling the southern region of Bali Island from the end of 18th century until conquered by the Dutch in 1906. Your first stop will be at the Bajra Sandhi Monument, which commemorates the Balinese struggle against Dutch colonialism. Designed in the shape of a Hindu bell, the monument contains dozens of detailed dioramas that depict Bali's long history, including the introduction of Hinduism and the country's eventual independence. Next, visit the traditional Badung Market which is located in the heart of the city. It is open 7 days a week, 24 hours a day making it the busiest market in Bali. This market has become the main trade center for all convenience goods from groceries to spices, fish and meat, clothing, kitchen crafts and batik textiles. It offers a glimpse into the hustle and bustle of the lives of the locals. If you find something you like don't be shy to negotiate! Next, visit the Bali Museum and then on the north side of the city, visit the glorious Temple of Jagatnatha, a Hindu Kahyangan Temple. You will stop briefly at the Inna Bali Heritage Hotel for a refreshment break. This hotel was the first international class hotel in Bali and is steeped in history. World leaders such as Queen Elizabeth, Charlie Chaplin, Mahatma Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru, Ir Soekarno Untuk Megawati and other prominent figures have all stayed here in room 77. Following your brief refreshment stop, you will transfer to the port where you will embark the luxurious Regent Seven Seas Navigator.

March 23 (Sat) Bali, Indonesia (B, L, D)

Explore the road-less-traveled charms of **Northern Bali** from this busy port. In **Bali Barat National Park**, immerse yourself in **brilliant coral reefs**, **mangrove forests and wildlife** that includes over 160 different bird species. Gaze upon the stunning water temple of **Pura Ulun Danu Batur** on the shores of **Lake Bratan**. And in **Singaraja**, admire architectural remnants of the Dutch colonial period as well as the **Royal Palace of Singaraja**, which descendants of the last Raja of Buleleng still call home.

March 24 (Sun) Surabaya, Indonesia (B, L, D)

Surabaya is the gateway to a world of wonders, from Buddhist temples to Arab quarters. You will notice the vast differences in architecture as you move around the various neighborhoods. In particular, tour the **Sampoerna Museum**, a well-preserved historical site built in the 19th-century Dutch colonial-style. Also, visit the **Grand Mosque of Surabaya** and witness the tall minaret, with exquisite bright blue and green mosaic tiles on the top of the pyramid-looking roof and dome. It's a 21st-century masterpiece showcasing stylish religious structural design and layout. There's plenty to do in the city center of Surabaya, whether you're a history buff, a shopper or an intrepid foodie.



Seven Seas Navigator is small (only 490 passengers), but it's also incredibly spacious and you'll rarely see crowds or queues. Its smallest suites start at 301 square feet, large enough for uncrowded sleeping and sitting areas, walk-in closets and large bathrooms with separate bathtub and shower.

More a business center than a city for tourists, it is, however, an excellent gateway to the mountainous interior of Central Java and only some 60 miles away from world-famous Borobudur.

Ho Chi Minh is Vietnam's largest and most famous city. During the 14th century this city was known as Prey Nokor and was nothing more than a trading post. By the 18th century, the Lords of Hue, under the Nguyens, had established control of the trade in Prey Nokor and renamed the city Saigon. After the Vietnam War, the new communist regime changed the official name of the city of Saigon, to Ho Chi Minh and began to rebuild its economic and social structure. During your two full days here in Ho Chi Minh, you will have the chance to take numerous tours that show you the History and Culture of this country.

April 1 (Mon) Nha Trang, Vietnam (B, L, D)

Nha Trang is situated in Vietnam's southern **Champa Kingdom** along the **Song Cai River**. In ancient times, this southern region was once a peaceful Champa settlement. It was attacked by the Vietnamese at the end of the 15th century, though it remained under Champa control until the mid-17th century when the **Nguyen Lords of Hue** took possession. From the city of Nha Trang, several ancient Cham Towers can be visited, each revealing details of the unique culture of the Chams.

April 2 (Tue) Day at Sea (B, L, D)

Today you will enjoy the day relaxing on the **Regent Seven Seas Navigator** as we sail the **South China Sea**.

April 3 (Wed) Sihanoukville, Cambodia (B, L, D)

Think beaches and snorkeling, as **Sihanoukville** sits on the beautiful island-studded **Bay of Thailand**. Wats, or **Buddhist temples**, are abundant and often modest architecturally, as seen at Wat Otres behind Otres Beach. There are even two wats in **Ream National Park**, a birdwatcher's paradise.

April 4 (Thurs) Bangkok, Thailand (B)

Bangkok is the capital and largest city in Thailand. The city has vastly modernized and undergone numerous changes, including the introduction of transportation and utility infrastructure in the reigns of **King Mongkut and King Chulalongkorn**, and quickly developed into the economic **Centre of Thailand**. We will depart from here for our return flight to Minneapolis today.
