Lewis & Clark Confluence Tower

This huge tower is located in Wood River and offers three platforms to look at the surrounding areas, including where the Missouri and Mississippi rivers meet. Piasa Bird

Cahokia Mounds

Cahokia Mounds is located near Collinsville and is the site of many large mounds that look a bit like hills. They were created by people who lived here a very, very long time ago!

You can walk to the top of Monks Mound, but it's SO TALL you have to walk up lots and lots of steps to get there. In the picture below, the people on the stairs look like little dots. That's how high up they are!

Great Flood of 1993

I'm sure you've seen the big flour mill in Alton, but did you know that the lines at the bottom show how high the water rose during two floods?

The black strip along the bottom of the mill shows the water level from 1973. You can see it's nearly as tall as the car. The red line is the water level from 1993, WAY over the tops of even the trucks!

Ask your parents or grandparents if they remember the flood. They'll probably have some great stories to share with you about it!




