Jamie Hasenyager was our guest speaker at the March Emerald Club meeting. Jamie is The City of Raymore's Animal Control Officer and coordinates the activities of Raymore's Animal Shelter. Ms. Hasenyager presented information about the shelter and included pictures of some of their past residents.

Licensing your dog or cat is no longer required in the City of Raymore. Instead, Jamie recommends having them permanently micro chipped.

There were approximately 750 animals brought into the shelter in 2021. This is an extremely busy department of the city with only 2 officers. The Raymore Police Department helps when they can, but Jamie & Bailey still may get calls at 2:00 in the morning.

Here is a list of our animal control officer's responsibilities:

- Care for animals at the Shelter
- All cleaning/record keeping at the Shelter
- Promoting lost/found animals & animal adoptions
- Pet adoptions & shelter-to-shelter transfers
- Trapping feral cats/wildlife
- Relocating wildlife – assist Missouri Conservation Department
- Recovering deceased animals
- Animals running at large

- Animal abuse or neglect
- Noise complaints
- Aggressive animals/animal bites
- Welfare checks
- Wildlife: coyotes, bats, raccoons, opossums, skunks, deer, fox, snakes, etc.
- Livestock: horses, cattle/calves, goats, etc.
